O'CINNSEALAIGH**

ordained in 1993, is Pastor of Our Lady of Victory in Delhi, Ohio. He was appointed President of the Athenaeum and Rector of Mount St. Mary's Seminary of the West by Archbishop Schnurr in 2011 as well as the first recipient of the Daniel E. Pilarczyk Chair of Systematic Theology. Having been born in Ireland, Fr. O'Cinnsealaigh came to the United States in 1993 for post-graduate studies and became a US Citizen in 2000. He was first assigned as a parochial vicar at Holy Angels, Sidney, Ohio and to Mount St. Mary's Seminary of the West in 2000.

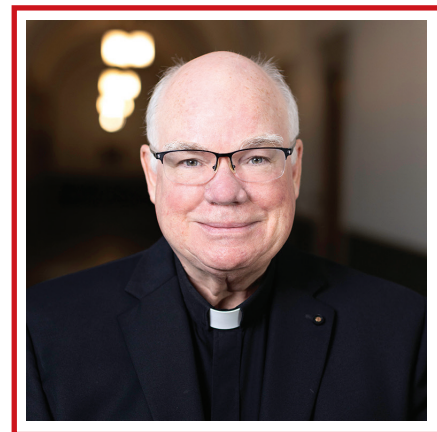

ordained in 2002, is President/Rector of Mount St. Mary's Seminary and School of Theology, appointed by Archbishop Schnurr in May, 2018. Father's previous assignments include parochial vicar and the administrator of Our Lady of the Visitation Parish, Cincinnati as well as faculty member of Elder High School. He has been a member of the teaching and formation faculties at Mount St. Mary's Seminary and School of Theology since 2008 and was appointed Vice-Rector/Director of Formation for the Seminary and Director of Formation of the Permanent Deacon Program in 2011.

Fr. Brausch holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy from the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio; a Masters of Divinity from the Athenaeum of Ohio; and, a licentiate and doctorate in philosophy from the Gregorian University in Rome.

ARMSTRONG**

ordained in 1980, is currently a Spiritual Director for the Mount Saint Mary Seminary, Cincinnati, Ohio. Previously he served as judicial vicar for the Archdiocese of Military Services (2014 – 2020). He has been pastor of St. Louis Parish (1999 – 2003) and St. Antoninus Parish (2003 – 2014) in addition to serving as parochial vicar at a number of parishes including, Holy Angels, Sidney, St. Michael, Fr. Loramie, St. Louis and St. William, Cincinnati. He was also a religion teacher at Lehman Catholic High School. Finally, Fr. Armstrong had a number of administrative assignments including Administrative Assistant to Archbishop Pilarczyk, Vice Chancellor, Executive Secretary of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council (1992-1994), Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (1996-2003) Censor Librorum and a Second Instance Judge for the Tribunal of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati as well as teaching Canon Law at the Seminary when needed.

Fr. Armstrong graduated from St. Gregory College Seminary in 1976 and completed his theological studies at the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome with an STB in Theology and a STL in Spirituality (1976-1981). He also has a license and doctorate in Canon Law from The Catholic University of America and a doctorate in Theology from the International Marian Research Institute.

JACQUELINE M. KEISER graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1985 with a BS in General Engineering and a major in International Relations/Political Science. She was commissioned a 2LT in the US Army as a Signal Corps Officer. After serving five years in the Army concluding as a Commanding Officer of an Airborne Signal Company at Ft.
